Being An Additional Insured On A General Contractor's Policy May Be Fool's Gold

Under ordinary circumstances, when an owner and a General Contractor get together to prepare a contract, the focus is on the time and price. Both parties want to know how long the job will take and what it will cost. Tangential issues, such as insurance, are usually glossed over and given very little attention. Very rarely is the contract compared to the actual insurance policy. This could be a major mistake.

Where the owner gets the General Contractor to indemnify the owner for the owner's negligence, the policy will provide that the carrier will pay all sums legally due from the General Contractor.

Suppose the owner accidentally cuts the electric on the project, and 50 men are stranded on various part of the job. One falls down and gets hurt or killed. The owner turns to the General Contractor's policy which provides that the carrier will pay only

General Obligations Law of the State of New York prohibits anyone from making a contract that will absolve him of his own negligence. Thus, the carrier disclaims and the owner has no coverage.

In another instance, the General Contractor's contract might be for \$10,000,000 with a \$500,000 deductible. Does the owner know that?

I can list many situations where being named as an additional insured on a General Contractor's policy is fool's gold.

The important lesson to be learned is take the insurance clause of the contract and the insurance policy to your insurance broker and make sure the two are in sync. Do not rely upon a sample endorsement where the owner is an additional insured on the General Contractor's policy.

Never let your lien time run out.

Part Two: Non-Compete Agreements And Terminated Employees

Our March article provided an overview of non-compete, non-solicitation and confidentiality agreements. This article will focus more on terminating employees with and without cause and the enforceability of a non-compete agreement.

Enforcement of non-compete agreements varies from State to State. In New York, Courts generally will not enforce a non-compete agreement where an employee has been terminated without cause. A recent Court thought the issue was as follows, "Enforcing a noncompetition provision when the employee has been discharged without cause would be 'unconscionable' because it would destroy the mutuality of obligation on which a covenant not to compete is based." Essentially, most courts will not enforce an agreement in which an employee is terminated from employ without cause and not able to obtain gainful employment due to a restrictive agreement. Paraphrasing a case I read recently, an employer should not be able to use offensively an anticompetition clause coupled with a forfeiture provision to economically cripple a former employee and simultaneously deny other potential employers his services.

However, New York Courts hold employees to the same standard. "An employee should not be permitted to violate the terms of his employment contract, thereby giving the employer just cause for terminating him, and yet still be allowed both to compete with, and still collect benefits from, the former employer after his termination." It has long been held in New York that non-compete agreements will be enforceable when an employee has been terminated for cause.

Employers should ensure that they are documenting employment issues in the employee's personnel file according to the company policy. Further, employers should ensure that they are thinking about the enforceability of these agreements at the drafting stage. A well written, clear and concise employment agreement will have a better chance of Court enforcement, than one that does not coincide with current laws and regulations.

Other aspects surrounding enforceability are the choice of law clauses, venue clauses and arbitration clauses. The choice of law clause selects the State law that is to be ap-

plied to the agreement. For example, a New York employer hires an employee who resides in New Jersey. The employer wants to ensure that the law of the State of New York is utilized in any disputes that may arise out of the agreement. Therefore, the employer inserts a choice of law clause in the employment agreement to both document and notify the employee that disputes will utilize New York law.

Also, the employer should select a favorable venue. If an employer's business is in Queens, the employer should select Queens County as the venue. Employers should be aware that they should select a venue that they have ties to.

Lastly, employers may want to select to arbitrate employment disputes. Arbitration clauses generally state that all disputes that arise out of the agreement will be arbitrated. There are many different arbitration organizations an employer can choose from, and some are more expensive than others. Employers should place a well phrased arbitration clause into an employment agreement. Arbitration always saves employers money when disputes arise out of an employment agreement.

It is very important to ensure that these decisions are made prior and during the drafting phase of the employment agreement. As previously explained in our March article, many times employers only learn about the protections afforded to them, after it's too late.
