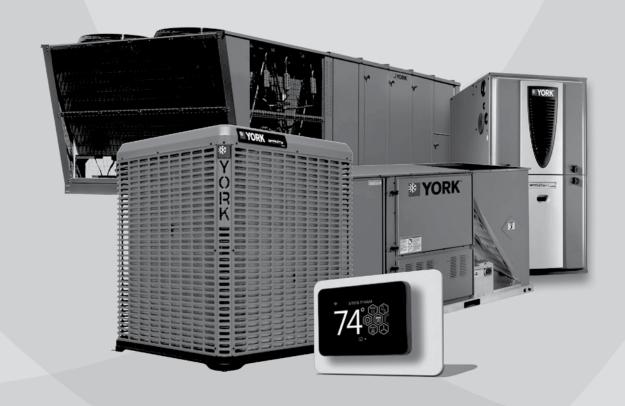

Victory for the **Geothermal Heat** Pump Industry

# **Congress** Reinstates **Geothermal Heat Pump Tax Credits**

The U.S. geothermal heat pump (GHP) industry scored a victory for its workforce and their employers as federal legislation was passed to extend federal tax credits for residential and commercial installations of GHPs. The measure was included in the Continuing Resolution spending bill approved by Congress.



The reinstated GHP tax credits are retroactive to Jan. 1, 2017, and extended to Jan. 1, 2022. The language also changes an important consideration for commercial GHP projects, making them eligible if commenced by Jan. 1, 2022 rather than placed in service.

"Today's action by Congress finally fixes the inequity created two years ago when tax credits for solar installations were extended through 2021," stated Geothermal Exchange Organization (GEO) President and CEO Doug Dougherty, "Credits for technologies including GHPs, fuels cells, microturbines, small wind and combined heat and power were left to expire at the end of 2016.

Since then it was an uphill fight, as GEO and its allies worked diligently for parity with the solar industry through bills in both the House and Senate. GEO's message to legislators was ultimately heard: Congress shouldn't be picking winners and losers when it comes to renewable energy and fairness in tax policy. "And now we have finally achieved parity with solar," said Dougherty.

Coalition partners included all of the "orphaned" clean energy technologies, and among others, the

National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, the National Association of Homebuilders, and the Air Conditioning Contractors of America. In the days prior to passage, GEO joined a larger coalition of business, energy, transportation, real estate, and agriculture stakeholders who gathered forces to make their case for including tax extenders in the CR that passed the Senate and the House.

GEO's relentless campaign to regain GHP tax credits included several Executive Fly-Ins to Washington DC in 2017, plus GEO Board Members, staff and industry volunteers making hundreds of visits to House and Senate legislative offices. Grassroots efforts by GEO members and supporters included job site visits set up for key legislators to show them firsthand the value of GHPs and plead the industry's case for tax credit parity with solar.

"Achieving this critical milestone for our industry couldn't have been accomplished without the positive and aggressive leadership of GEO staff, GEO manufacturers and members, our DC lobbying team—and the tireless efforts of my fellow board members during several Fly Ins to Washington during the past two years," said GEO Board Chairman Joe Parsons (EarthLinked Technologies, Inc.).

"Our hard-fought victory for the GHP industry helps ensure a bright future for our technology," said Dougherty. "It will stem the loss of jobs we now face, provide more time to overcome market barriers, achieve economies of scale, and help spread the environmental and economic benefits of GHPs across America."

# People & The Workplace

## **HELPFUL HINTS - Part 1**

I did a canvass of the labor professionals in our organization and asked them each the same question: What advice would you give to your clients to help them avoid employment law litigation? Somehow I am not surprised at the answers since I have been advocating most of these principles to MACC members for probably twenty (20) years. So here it goes Part 1 of this series - next month I will address common mistakes that can put your company at risk of employment claims:

- 1. Be sure you document and if you are not sure re-document so that the personnel file reflects the events concerning the employee that form a basis for counseling/discipline.
- 2. Treat all employees the same. Treat them with the same respect and dignity that you would give to members of your own family and to of course your clientele.
- 3. Remain proactive and react to problems promptly, handle it and address it since it will not go away by itself.

- 4. Always keep detailed records in case the matter has to be referred to counsel for action. These days most employees know what agencies to go to if they believe they have been harshly treated. Whether it is discrimination, wage and hour, unemployment or the like, the detailed records that you keep will assist your counsel in handling the matter proficiently and to your satisfaction.
- 5. Be sure to communicate with your employees throughout the process once it commences. Follow-up is essential and the smile goes a long way.
- 6. Review your hiring practices to see that you are vetting correctly. Try to discern if there is a problem or a misfit before the person becomes part of your organization.
- 7. Have some familiarity with the laws that govern employers in the City and the State of New York. We often times read about federal rules and regulations but also understand that State and City rules and regulations are much more liberal and often times more expansive in their protections of employees.
- 8. Keep current on training train supervision not only to recognize problems but to handle problems effectively in consultation with your HR Department or your labor relations expert.
- 9. Train your managers and supervision at least once every eighteen (18) months to stay in tune with state and federal rules and regulations in the workplace.
- 10. Be sure to adhere to your policies fairly and uniformly as to all employees. Managers must know the policies in order to implement them fairly and in a nondiscriminatory fashion.
- 11. Last but not least. If you are going to investigate and submit the materials to your representative. act in a polite, courteous and thorough fashion. It

is not the time for dishonesty or veiled innuendo or threats. It is the time to garner facts so that your file is complete.

"Because of this, R-22 replacements are quickly becoming a part of regular HVAC maintenance. Replacement refrigerants work differently in a variety of ways, including operating at different pressures and temperatures and at the very least the need to recalibrate to the correct Superheat and Subcool settings. Most replacements reduce cooling capacity and energy efficiency, leading to higher operating costs and negating the environmental benefits of replacing R-22 in the first place. # **Change Orders** and Meticulous Records

Change orders are often a major issue in construction litigation. Whether certain work was included in the initial scope of work can sometimes be a matter of debate. It is always best practices to have all change orders in writing and signed by all parties — it can certainly help avoid issues of proof in the event litigation ensues. The question I am often asked is when a contract requires that change orders be written, will a contractor be precluded from compensation for the additional work if he or she failed to get a written change order.

Contractors and subcontractors are often instructed

(516) 677-5183 John@associationdev.com by owners to go ahead with certain additional work with a verbal acknowledgment that payment will be forthcoming. After, the extra work is completed, sometimes owners will try and avoid payment by alleging that all of the change orders were required to be written pursuant to the underlying contract.

While it is best to have written change orders, the law is that oral directions to perform extra work or even the general course of conduct between the parties may modify or eliminate contract provisions requiring written authorizations or notices of claims. Thus, if a contractor completed certain work that was outside the initial scope, it will be entitled to compensation.

Keeping meticulous records and having an attorney review your contract can help avoid many potential issues. Never let your lien time run out!!
