President's Message

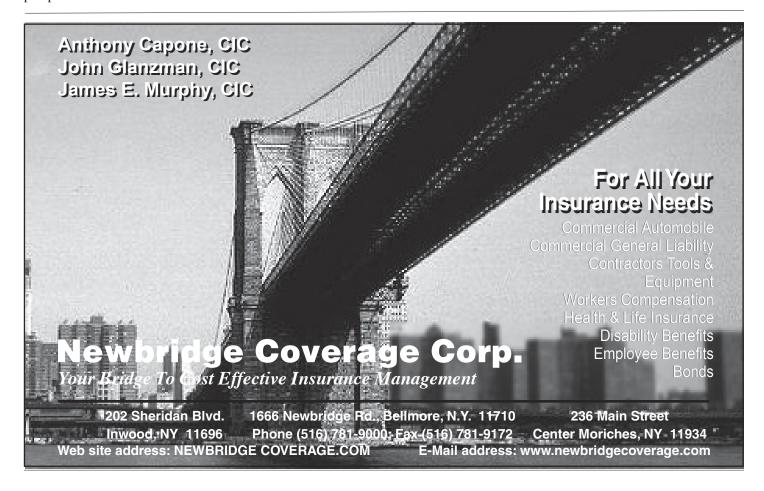

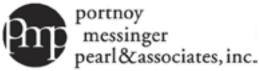
I want to thank all of you who support the ACCA organization and the Contractor News. Without the financial support of our associates and contractors, we would not be able to convey all this topical information and wisdom.

NEW I-9 FORMS REQUIRED Effective December 26, 2007

The revised Form I-9 is now available for employers to use. US employers are required to document that all citizen and non citizen employees hired after November 6, 1986 are eligible to work in the United States. Only one document, Unexpired Employment Authorization Document (I-766) was added to the List of Acceptable Documents from List A. The most significant change to the revised Form I-9 is the elimination of five documents from List A of the List of Acceptable Documents. These are:

- 1. Certificate of U.S. Citizenship (Form N-560 or N-570)
- 2. Certificate of Naturalization (Form N-550 or N-570)
- 3. Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-151)
- 4. Unexpired Re-entry Permit (Form I-327)
- 5. Unexpired Refugee Travel Document (Form I-571) Employers must begin using the revised I-9 by Decem-

ber 26, 2007. Both the revised form and the "Handbook for Employers, Instructions for Completing the Form I-9" are available online at www.uscis.gov. The new form should be used for all NEW employees. Current employees with valid I-9's will not be required to fill out the revised forms. Failure to use the new forms can result in stiff penalties. HOLIDAY PARTIES: Helpful hints to avoid litigation

Not only do holiday parties hosted by employers demonstrate employee appreciation, they also keep tradition alive and boost company morale.

Several employee-related lawsuits have brought attention to ways in which employers should protect themselves. Here are some ways employers or party hosts can avoid legal pitfalls:

- The employer should not invite clients; this infers a business purpose and can cause a court to construe cases in favor of the employee.
- Attendance should be voluntary and never "strongly encouraged."
- The venue should be away from the office, not during

- working hours, and the employer should not offer compensation for attendance.
- If an employer must provide alcohol the employer should consider limiting alcohol intake by serving alcohol with a meal or limited drink tickets.
- Employers should strongly encourage people to drink responsibly and remind employees that the party is a professional gathering.
- Employers should never provide alcohol to minor employees, volunteers or interns.
- Employers should offer taxi vouchers.
- The employer/host should never give someone who is drunk more alcohol and should never allow someone who is drinking to drive home.

Proper Collection of a Medical Leave Proof of Absence

The Federal Family & Medical Leave Act (FMLA) allows eligible employees to take up to twelve weeks of unpaid job protected leave each year for an employee's "serious health condition," or to care for a parent, spouse or child with a "serious health condition." To help determine if an ailment rises to the serious condition, employees may be required to

submit medical certification. Most often, medical certification is in the form of a doctor's note that spells out the ailment, diagnosis and cure period.

While the law doesn't require employers to obtain medical certification from employees who take an FMLA leave, it is prudent to ask for certification in certain situations.

FMLA fraud has been a serious problem in recent years. While employees may be legally allowed to take FMLA leave in small increments (intermittent leave on a daily or even hourly basis.) Some employers have discovered that employees are increasingly using intermittent FMLA in a noticeable pattern on Fridays and Mondays.

Extending an employee's weekend may be considered *Continued on page 12*

FMLA fraud. In order for an employer to combat possible fraudulent FMLA use, the employer should ask for re-certification when such a pattern is noticed. FMLA permits employers to request such recertification on a reasonable basis.

Typically, FMLA recertification can be requested no more than once in every 30-day period and only in connection with an actual absence. However, if you have information that makes you suspect that an employee has abused FMLA leave, then you should ask for recertification more frequently than 30 days.

Generally speaking, the medical certification response should contain the employee's name, the patient's name, the type of health condition, some medical facts supporting the certification, the date the health condition began, the health condition's likely duration, and any facts that concern the need to take reduced or intermittent leave. If the employee cannot perform certain types of work during the FMLA period, the doctor should indicate what essential functions of the job can or cannot be performed. Finally, you can require that the health care provided would sign the certification and submit it in a timely fashion.

I hope these items help you when confronting an issue of intermittent FMLA leave. Of course, each individual situation presents a specific scenario, which must be individually analyzed. Measuring Up: Case Studies of Green **Building Energy Performance Shared** in ASHRAE Seminar

When it comes to high-performance buildings, the proof is performance.

Measuring actual energy performance, however, can be challenging due to inadequate modeling practices, failure to include operations staff in goal setting, and lack of adequate budgets for commissioning, evaluations and ongoing benchmarking.

Validity of Oral Change Orders

In the past, I wrote various articles about how you must get your agreements signed before you do any work. This included the contract, any change orders, purchase orders, etc.

Ialso instructed everyone to review the terms of the contract so that they are clear and unambiguous. It is imperative that you understand the terms and conditions of the agreement as clearly as you understand your bid.

Recently, a decision was rendered by the Appellate Division. Second Department, which could have lasting effects on the construction industry in New York.

In the public sector, a change order will not be paid unless there is a written and authorized change order executed by the parties. In the private sector, however, a change order is valid, even if it is oral and the contract directs written C.O.'s, as long as it was authorized and the work performed was outside of the scope of the contract. The rationale for this rule is that the parties may waive any portion of the contract and as long as the work performed is outside of the scope of the contract, the owner should be obligated to pay for it.

Recently, however, the Court found in a private sector project that where a contract executed between the parties ex-

pressly precludes oral extras or change orders not documented in writing and the owner disputes the extras or change orders, the claim may be dismissed.

This is the first time that I have come across a decision which dismissed oral change orders where the contract directed that they be in writing.

Ramifications of this decision could be severe. Most contractors are told in the field to do certain work which is outside of the scope of the contract and the paperwork will follow later on. Many times the paperwork does not follow and you are forced to invoice the change order without having a signed change order.

According to this decision, you perform the work at your own peril. While it may cause your job to be performed at a slower pace, it appears that the Courts are now directing that you receive a signed written change order pursuant to the terms of the agreement before you commence with your work.

Never let your lien time run out!!

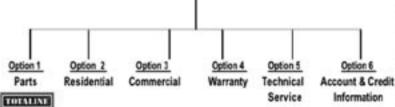
